THE DIRECTOR'S CORNER

September is National Suicide Prevention Awareness Month!

We all know what a tragedy suicide is not only for the family of the victim but also friends, classmates and school staff. Many of our schools are using evidence-based programs to address prevention and intervention.

The Colorado Department of Public Health and Environment's Office of Suicide Prevention (OSP) oversees the <u>Colorado Suicide Prevention Commission</u> established in 2014. The Commission has set a goal of reducing suicide by 20% by 2024 by securing sustainable funding for the promotion of evidence-based practices and data-driven recommendations that include policy and systems-level change. The priorities and recommendations have included integrated healthcare, training and education, and resilience and community connectedness approaches. 
