THE DIRECTOR'S CORNER

Dear Colleagues: Happy New Year! With high hopes that 2021 will be a much better year than 2020. I know we still have a long way to go to eradicate this virus, but vaccines are here and I am confident we will return to a semblance of normal sometime in 2021.

NEW Colorado School Safety Academy: After consultation with some of our state's school safety partners, the School Safety Resource Center has decided to facilitate an annual Academy with the purpose of training a School Safety Specialist for any district that would like to have a staff member in this position. This individual(s) will be trained in the baseline school safety knowledge we believe every district should have utilizing the five preparedness missions of the U.S. Department of Education.

- The first Academy will be held **VIRTUALLY from Monday until Friday the week of June 7, 2021 from 8:00 AM until 12:00 Noon.** Please save the date and registration will open later this year.
- Partners joining us to educate the Specialists will be from CDE, Colorado Crisis Services, Safe2Tell, CSDSIP, the I Love You Guys Foundation, the JeffCo/DeAngelis Center and a number of other agencies.
- There will be no charge for this Academy but in order to receive a certificate as a School Safety Specialist, participants must be present all five mornings.

In the meantime, CSSRC staff will continue our **Monday and Friday virtual workshops** for anyone with time to join us. We have added some additional topics so <u>please check the training calendar</u>. Remember, if you would like any of these workshops for your staff as a group that can easily be arranged. In addition, you will get a certificate for continuing education hours by attending and completing an evaluation.

Our **CSSRC website** is being migrated to a newer platform over the next few weeks. We do not anticipate any disruption on the users' end but we wanted to let you know. We have trimmed many of the older resources and we have submitted a grant proposal to make searching our library of resources even easier. I will keep you updated. As school staff continue to support students, Margaret Ochoa, our Child Sexual Abuse Prevention Specialist, has been sharing with me the concerns that some students who are **victims of sexual abuse** are not reporting to trusted adults but rather on social media. <u>Here is an article with more information</u>. I urge you to take accusations seriously and follow your requirements as mandated reporters in an effort to help keep all of our children safe and prevent them from resorting to social media to be heard.

STILL RECRUITING CSSRC STOP Grant: Threat Assessment Training & Implementation

- The CSSRC is recruiting more sites for threat assessment training and implementation
- We need sites where CSSRC staff have NOT trained in threat assessment as well as a few where we have trained in the past.
- The lift for school sites is minimal just training evaluations to complete along with the training and a brief collection of data every six months.
- We also realize that adding another project to your school's work may be overwhelming right now. Please know that the grant project continues until 9/30/2022. If you believe you might be interested later in the process, please call to get your district/school on the list now.
- Staff can be paid stipends for the training and data collection under the grant if training is conducted after regular working hours.
- This final training phase of the grant will extend from September 2020 through August 2021.
- CSSRC staff have been working with the Governor's Office of Information Technology and will be piloting a secure, on-line protocol with the remaining sites. Schools will be able to store their assessments and track the at-risk students' Response Management Support Plans with automatic notifications for review meetings, among other features. This will be available free of charge to districts even when the grant work is completed.
