### 2022 School Bus Survey Key Findings

- The <u>Busing on the Lookout (BOTL)</u> team had a very busy summer at conferences and in-service training, they also took time to get feedback from school bus drivers, supervisors and trainers regarding what they have seen and materials they can create on anti-trafficking to assist them.

- <u>Mental Health First Aid (MHFA)</u> is a course that teaches individuals how to identify, understand and respond to signs of mental illnesses and substance use disorders.
- The training gives people the skills they need to reach out and provide initial help and support to someone who may be developing a mental health or substance use problem or experiencing a crisis.
- <u>The Colorado Chapter of Mental Health First Aid (MHFACO)</u> receives grant funding through the Office of SP to help pay for courses for specialty populations, including courses in Spanish. MHFACO can also help those who may not qualify for grant funding to set up courses.

### School Mental Health & School Safety Professionals' Groups

### Networking Group for Managing Problematic Sexual Behaviors (PSB)

- As noted above, the CSSRC has facilitated informal meetings for school staff who oversee either suicide prevention and intervention or threat assessments in their buildings. Those professionals identified a desire to have separate meetings regarding problematic sexual behaviors (PSB) in students.
- The PSB working group will meet regularly in 2022-2023. Surveys indicated that the participants are interested in meeting for 90 minutes every other month with content experts in the field.

- <u>The School Bullying Prevention and Education Grant (BPEG) program</u> is now accepting applications! Funding is available to support schools in reducing bullying by engaging students and families, implementing prevention best practices, and improving school climate.
- A maximum of \$35,000 per school, per year is available. Results from past cohorts of BPEG program grantees have shown that students consistently report an over 30% reduction in bullying when their schools participate in the grant.
