# THE DIRECTOR'S CORNER

#### **Dear Colleagues:**

I hope the new semester is going well. Staff at the CSSRC thought, as you are preparing your professional development calendars for next year, it is a good time to remind you of the workshops we can offer. We have added a number of new ones as new staff have come on board. Most of our work is now happening in-person but if you would like a workshop from a trainer in another part of the state, we are happy to present it virtually. Please remember that we serve ALL schools in Colorado, pre-K through higher education, including public, charter, and private schools.

- For teachers Trauma Sensitive Classrooms, Bullying Prevention, Utilizing Restorative Practices, Basic Mental Health Awareness for Educators, De- escalation Techniques and Secondary Traumatic Stress.

- Crisis response and Tips to Assist Parents and Caregivers After a Crisis
- Center staff are also certified trainers in PREPaARE Workshops 1 & 2, QPR, Youth Mental Health First Aid, Safe2Tell and after this summer in ASIST.

#### NEW CISA and FBI Release ESXiArgs Ransomware Recovery Guidance

- "<u>CISA</u> and the <u>Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI)</u> released a joint Cybersecurity Advisory, <u>ESXiArgs</u> <u>Ransomware Virtual Machine Recovery Guidance</u>. This advisory describes the ongoing ransomware campaign known as "ESXiArgs." Malicious cyber actors may be exploiting known vulnerabilities in unpatched and out-of-service or out-of-date versions of VMware ESXi software to gain access to ESXi servers and deploy ESXiArgs ransomware."

- <u>The Department of Homeleand Security and Emergency Management (DHSEM)</u> is pleased to announce that the State of Colorado's Legislature allocated \$5,820,000.00 for the 2023 <u>School Safety</u> <u>Disbursement (SSD) Grant Program</u>. 44 school districts and 18 individual schools have been selected to receive funding as directed by <u>HB22-1120</u>. The recommendations outlined in this policy have been designed to guide the collaborative development of a school resource officer program, while acknowledging the importance of local circumstances and youth development. This policy is composed of recommendations and are not mandatory changes imposed on any local entity.

### Secret Service Research Examines for the First Time Five Years of Mass Violence Data

- The <u>U.S. Secret Service National Threat Assessment Center (NTAC)</u> released Mass Attacks in Public Spaces: 2016 2020, a comprehensive report examining 173 incidents of targeted violence and highlighting the observable commonalities among the attackers.
