#### 2019 Need Assessment: There is still time!

- Thank you to all who participated in the 2019 Needs Assessment!
- Here is a **copy of the report** of the aggregated data.
- Five hundred and forty-nine folks answered the survey representing 869 schools.
- The good news is that of those who responded to the question of having an exercised EOP, the answer was a decided 89%.
- Please know, we are seriously looking at the components of school safety with which survey takers said they still would like assistance. We will focus on these topics at our upcoming regional trainings but feel free to contact the Center with any requests at your site.
- And now that we have three of our Regional Training Consultants on board, they are available to help our rural colleagues. (See their names and regions below)
- However, if you didn't get a chance to answer the survey for your school, we have reopened the <a href="link">link</a> so that you can still complete it. The Governor's office is hoping for an even greater percentage of our schools responding. If you are concerned about anonymity, skip the first two questions, but know that the CSSRC will resist any CORA requests to see the data as it is security sensitive.

# COLORADO SCHOOL SAFETY RESOURCE CENTER TRAINING NEW Student/Staff Safety Symposia:

- There will be three different events across the state:
  - Hayden: Yampa Regional Airport on Wednesday, December 4, 2019. View the <u>Agenda here</u>, register <u>here</u>.

- What: These symposia will be an opportunity for middle and high school students to hear a keynote
