



Helping teens **re-think** their relationship with tobacco

CHANCE

Second Chance is an on-line, interactive, and self-directed alternative to suspension program for teens who violate tobacco policy at school, or tobacco law in the community. The program may also be helpful for teens who are experimenting with tobacco, but have not violated policy or law.

Who Benefits from Second Chance

Schools, local health agencies, and youth-serving organizations can use the program as part of a comprehensive tobacco education and prevention strategy. Administrators have the ability to:

- Assign student usernames and passwords
- Track student progress in the program
- Analyze student demographics
- Review pre- and post-test results

The Rationale Behind Second Chance

A tobacco-free policy and an alternative to suspension program are part of a comprehensive approach to tobacco use prevention and cessation. A synergy should exist between all essential components of effective tobacco prevention for schools, including policy, classroom instruction, cessation, and parent, family, and community involvement.

Second Chance was developed in cooperation with the Colorado State Tobacco Education & Prevention Partnership through Amendment 35 voter-approved tobacco tax funds. Content was developed using a number of “best practice” sources and content experts in Colorado and nationwide.

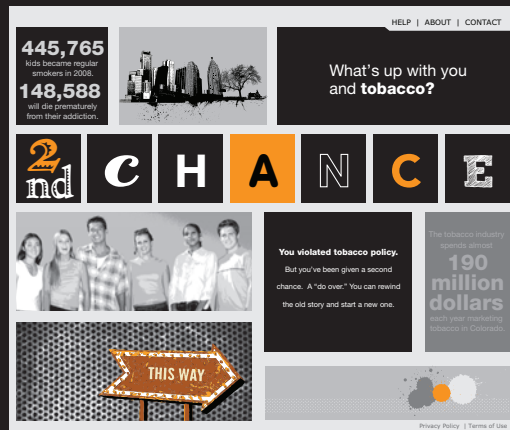

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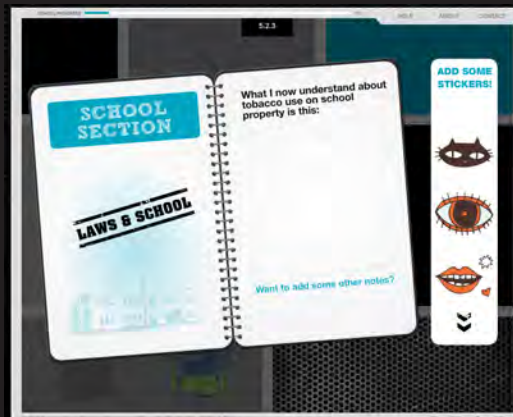

SECOND CHANCE

Program Goals & Objectives

A tobacco-free school policy and community tobacco laws may help reduce the amount of student smoking. Students are more likely to cooperate with the policy if emphasis is placed on education and support rather than on punishment. Second Chance is an online tobacco education program primarily intended as an alternative to school suspension or fines for youth who are in violation of the tobacco-free school policy or youth who violate state and local laws on the purchase and use of tobacco by minors.

Goals

- Increase student knowledge of and compliance with the tobacco-free school policy and community-based tobacco policy
- Increase student awareness about the benefits of not using tobacco
- Increase student awareness about skills and strategies that can be used to resist health risk behaviors
- Increase student interest in quitting or reducing tobacco use

Objectives

Following completion of the Second Chance education program youth will be able to:

- Describe why tobacco-free policies and laws exist
- Identify myths and facts about tobacco use and addiction
- Identify strategies used by the tobacco industry to target youth
- Discuss the financial impact of using tobacco
- Identify social norms related to youth tobacco use
- Discuss personal tobacco use behaviors
- Identify skills needed to resist, quit, or reduce tobacco use
- List resources available for youth tobacco prevention and cessation

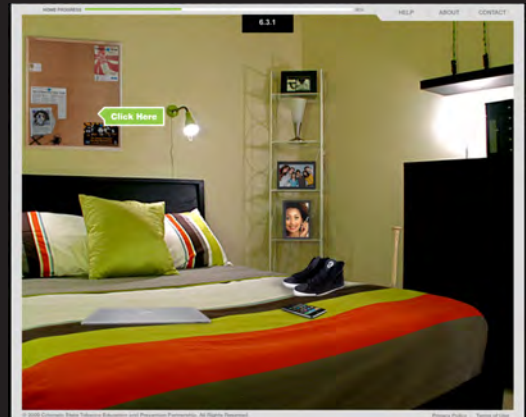
