CISA and FBI Release ESXiArgs Ransomware Recovery Guidance

- "<u>CISA</u> and the <u>Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI)</u> released a joint Cybersecurity Advisory, <u>ESXiArgs</u> <u>Ransomware Virtual Machine Recovery Guidance</u>. This advisory describes the ongoing ransomware campaign known as "ESXiArgs." Malicious cyber actors may be exploiting known vulnerabilities in unpatched and out-of-service or out-of-date versions of VMware ESXi software to gain access to ESXi servers and deploy ESXiArgs ransomware."

 "This document is meant to provide school administration and staff, as well as law enforcement agencies a model policy for the selection, training and evaluation of a School Resource Officer (SRO). The recommendations outlined in this policy have been designed to guide the collaborative development of a school resource officer program, while acknowledging the importance of local circumstances and youth development. This policy is composed of recommendations and are not mandatory changes imposed on any local entity.
