NEW | Matter

- The <u>Colorado Department of Human Services (CDHS) Office of Behavioral Health (OBH)</u> has launched "a program to promote youth emotional and mental health."
- <u>Colorado House Bill 21-1258</u> established this temporary behavioral health services program to provide access to mental health and substance use disorder services for youth, including addressing needs that may have resulted from the COVID-19 pandemic. The program is open to youth 18 years of age or younger or 21 years of age or younger if receiving special education services.
- The program provides up to 3 free behavioral health sessions for youth in Colorado and reimburses participating providers, which are licensed clinicians from agencies and independent contractors.
