Dear Colleagues: I hope this newsletter finds you relaxing and enjoying your summer break. It may be hard to think about the fall but we are busy planning here at the Center. We are just starting interviews for the two new Regional Training Consultants and hope to have them in place no later than Labor Day.

We also had a very successful Institutions of Higher Education Summer Safety Summit with 285 colleagues joining us at some point during the day. Sixteen participants became School Safety Specialists during our Academy earlier this summer. Our June training ended with 16 other participants being in-person trained in the NASP PREPaRE protocol. We look forward to offering a Train-the-Trainer sometime this fall with our partners from the Jeffco/DeAngelis Foundation. We appreciate their support!

The Center, in collaboration with the Center for the Study and Prevention of Violence and Safe2Tell, submitted a STOP Violence Grant to the National Institute of Justice for continuing the CSSRC's threat assessment work, supporting the training of SROs with NASRO workshops and a pilot project with S2T utilizing the Handle With Care program. We should have notification about the grant by October 1, 2022. Fingers crossed!

CSSRC STOP Grant: Threat Assessment Training & Implementation Still Recruiting

- The CSSRC is recruiting the final schools for threat assessment training and implementation under the grant. (**Don't worry, we will always continue to provide threat assessment training.**)
- We need sites where CSSRC staff have NOT trained in threat assessment as well as a few where we have trained in the past.
- The lift for school sites is minimal just training evaluations to complete, along with the training and a brief collection of data every six months.
- The summer will be the final opportunity to pay staff stipends for the training.
- Staff can be paid stipends for the training and data collection under the grant if training is conducted outside of regular working hours.

NEW Trevor Project's 2022 National Survey on LGBTQ Youth Mental Health

- "<u>The Trevor Project</u>'s 2022 National Survey on LGBTQ Youth Mental Health demonstrates that rates of suicidal thoughts have trended upward among LGBTQ young people over the last three years, making the need for educators and mental healthcare professionals to be aware of this community's experience all the more important."
- "Capturing the experiences of nearly 34,000 LGBTQ youth ages 13 to 24 across the United States, with 45% of respondents being LGBTQ youth of color and 48% being transgender or nonbinary, the Trevor Project's fourth annual national survey is one of the most diverse surveys of LGBTQ youth ever conducted."
- "As you review this information, please keep in mind the words of Dr. Myeshia Price (she/her or they/them), Senior Research Scientist from The Trevor Project, which cautions against regarding this vibrant community through the lens of a deficit perspective: 'Although our data continue to show high rates of mental health and suicide risk among LGBTQ young people, it is crucial to note that these rates vary widely based on the way LGBTQ youth are treated.'"

NEW Targeted Violence and Radicalization Prevention Grant Training

- <u>Nicoletti-Flater Associates (NFA)</u> in partnership with the <u>Frank DeAngelis Center (FDC)</u> received a targeted violence and radicalization prevention grant from the <u>Department of Homeland Security</u> (<u>DHS</u>). The DHS Grant allows NFA and DHS to provide detection and disruption training at no cost to Colorado based K-12 schools and college and universities campuses.

The no cost training is designed for Threat Assessment teams, Threat Management teams, Care teams, and BITs.
