CSSRC will be HIRING!

CSSRC Virtual Trainings Updated Schedule

National School Psychologist PREPaRE Workshop 2 Training- Only a few spots remain!

- PREPaRE Workshop 2 will be held in-person on Monday and Tuesday, June 27th and 28th. The location is the Frank DeAngelis Community Safety Center 6625 W 45th Pl, Wheat Ridge, CO 80033.
- NASP requires folks to be trained in-person before they can be trained as a trainer. We expect to offer a train-the-trainer workshop in the near future.
- The PREPaRE curriculum has been developed by the <u>National Association of School Psychologists</u> (<u>NASP</u>) as part of NASP's decade-long leadership in providing evidence-based resources and consultation related to school crisis prevention and response. PREPaRE training is ideal for schools committed to improving and strengthening their school safety and crisis management plans and emergency response.
- This training is **open to all mental health professionals, school administrators, teachers and school personnel** interested in learning about crisis prevention and response.
- There are no prior training requirements to attend this training but you must attend both days in their entirety to receive certification and the ability to attend the train-the-trainer.
- Training is free to participants thanks to support from the Jeffco DeAngelis Foundation! The usual cost is \$500/person so this is a wonderful opportunity.
