# THE DIRECTOR'S CORNER

Dear Colleagues: The School Safety Resource Center is excited to announce that Governor Polis signed <u>SB 23-241</u> on Thursday, April 27th establishing the new **Office of School Safety (OSS)** within the Department of Public Safety. Three units will make up the new OSS: the Colorado School Safety Resource Center (CSSRC), the Crisis Unit, and the Grants Unit. The bill takes effect on July 1, 2023 so transitions will be happening over the next few months.



Besides an additional Regional Training Coordinator and part-time analyst to help with the threat assessment data in the School Safety Resource Center, the Crisis Unit will train school mental health providers in the NASP PREPaRE model and be available to respond to a school in crisis when additional mental health support is needed. The Grants Unit will oversee the SAFER, School Security Disbursement and the new, as yet to be established, violence prevention grants. This unit will also research new grant opportunities for schools and find ways to make the process easier, especially for rural districts and schools.

Thanks goes to the Department of Public Safety for proposing the OSS, the Governor and his staff for supporting it and of course, the Colorado General Assembly for funding the Office. This is wonderful additional support for Colorado students and schools! Please watch for open positions at the OSS.

#### Other School Safety News:

- School Safety Working Group (SSWG) As required in SB20-023 and HB22-1274, the SSWG has started its work with state agencies reviewing their involvement in school safety to better coordinate services, reduce any possible duplication, make accessing resources easier and identify gaps. The first committee on Behavioral/Mental Health Services met on April 25th and the second committee on Accessing Services meets the first week of May. You can stay current on the SSWG's work from their <u>website</u> and even volunteer to assist.
- Complementing the work of the SSWG will be the **Colorado School Safety Initiative (CSSI)** facilitated by Confluence Policy and Strategy Group and the Public Education & Business Coalition (PEBC). "The group will explore the impact of community violence outside of schools on school safety, threat identification, and the role of School Resource Officers and others in responding to school based incidents as well as the role of other factors in the local community and the role of the press, including social media." Here is their latest press release.

As we approach summer, please remember to share safety plans and special needs of any students that will be in summer programs with their leaders. Ron Lee shared this article with the CSSRC team so I am <u>linking it here for you</u> as well.
