## Suicide Prevention Symposium REGISTRATION IS OPEN

- The annual Youth Suicide Prevention & Intervention Symposium will be held virtually on **Thursday**, **November 4, 2021.**
- This is co-sponsored by the CSSRC and the Office of Suicide Prevention.
- Keynote speakers will be Brandon Johnson from <u>SAMHSA</u>, who will address minority youth mental health issues; and John Ackerman, who is the Suicide Prevention Coordinator for the <u>Center for</u> <u>Suicide Prevention and Research at Nationwide Children's Hospital</u> who will discuss postvention in schools.
- The afternoon will be devoted to creating a suicide stratagy in your district and the CSSRC Youth Suicide Assessment and Intervention Toolkit for mental health providers who want to be trained to use the new instruments.

## CSSRC STOP Grant: Threat Assessment Training & Implementation Still Recruiting
