Great News! The CSSRC is excited to announce that the Bureau of Justice Assistance within the National Institute of Justice just **awarded a \$1,992,085 STOP Violence Grant to our office.** Working in collaboration with the Center for the Study and Prevention of Violence (CSPV) at the University of Colorado, Boulder, the National Association of School Resource Officers (NASRO) and Safe2Tell, within the Colorado Office of the Attorney General, the grant will run for three years. Grant activities include extending the Colorado Threat Assessment and Management Protocol (CTAMP) work, including adding more online licenses, training for SROs and their supervisors across the state, rolling out NASRO's *Project Unite* program to school and community safety teams and piloting Handle With Care in three districts. NEW 2022 School Bus Survey Key Findings

- The <u>Busing on the Lookout (BOTL)</u> team had a very busy summer at conferences and in-service training, they also took time to get feedback from school bus drivers, supervisors and trainers regarding what they have seen and materials they can create on anti-trafficking to assist them.

NEW Bring Mental Health First Aid (MHFA) to your community!

- <u>Mental Health First Aid (MHFA)</u> is a course that teaches individuals how to identify, understand and respond to signs of mental illnesses and substance use disorders.
- The training gives people the skills they need to reach out and provide initial help and support to someone who may be developing a mental health or substance use problem or experiencing a crisis.
- <u>The Colorado Chapter of Mental Health First Aid (MHFACO)</u> receives grant funding through the Office of SP to help pay for courses for specialty populations, including courses in Spanish. MHFACO can also help those who may not qualify for grant funding to set up courses.

National Institute of Justice Examines Effectiveness of School Violence Training

- <u>The National Institute of Justice (NIJ)</u> "published an article examining the effectiveness of school violence training provided to school personnel and school-based law enforcement."
- "Though the training varies, they may be focused on preventing an issue before it becomes an imminent threat or responding to a threat or crisis when it arises."
- "Research suggests that training school personnel to prevent and respond to a variety of situations impacting school safety can be effective. However, the degree of evidence varies by training topic and program type. The article discusses four of the most common training topics and considers future directions for further research."
