WARNING: The Drug Enforcement Agency (DEA) has <u>issued a warning</u> about new rainbow-colored fentanyl making its way into the United

States. This candy-flavored and colored fentanyl is extremely dangerous. Please remind students not to touch or ingest anything they are not sure about and report unidentified pills to parents, school officials or the police. If your district has not ordered Narcan from CDPHE, please see the reminder on page 6 (below) for how to do that.

We are still asking superintendents/BOCES Directors (or their designee) to complete the survey on locks and exterior building doors that was sent previously. We plan to present aggregate results to lawmakers as they consider additional school security measures. You can access the <u>link here</u>. Thank you!

We also know that "swatting" has become an issue for some of our schools and also across the nation. We are working on a plan to bring greater awareness to the dangers of "swatting" and the consequences. We will share more information as it becomes available. #### NEW Reminder of the Healthy Kids Colorado & Smart Source Surveys

- Healthy Kids Colorado Survey (HKCS) and Colorado Healthy Schools Smart Source (Smart Source), are Colorado's widely-administered surveys on the health and well-being of young people and school health policies and practices that support youth health.
- Data from HKCS and Smart Source are complementary and can be used together to provide a more complete picture of youth and school health. Check out <u>this video</u> to learn more!

#### NEW National Institute of Justice Examines Effectiveness of School Violence Training

- <u>The National Institute of Justice (NIJ)</u> "published an article examining the effectiveness of school violence training provided to school personnel and school-based law enforcement."
- "Though the training varies, they may be focused on preventing an issue before it becomes an imminent threat or responding to a threat or crisis when it arises."
- "Research suggests that training school personnel to prevent and respond to a variety of situations impacting school safety can be effective. However, the degree of evidence varies by training topic and program type. The article discusses four of the most common training topics and considers future directions for further research."

#### REMINDER Naloxone Bulk Purchase Fund Opportunity

- The <u>Colorado Department of Public Health and Environment (CDPHE)</u> shared "<u>Colorado Senate Bill</u> <u>19-227</u> created the Opiate Antagonist - Naloxone Bulk Purchase Fund. It allows eligible entities (**including schools**) to purchase opiate antagonists, such as naloxone or Narcan, at low or no cost."
- Public schools are eligible through their district only.
- Private and charter schools are also eligible and must have developed a policy that is approved by their governing body, whatever form the governing body takes.
