## **CURRENT GRANT OPPORTUNITIES**

## NEW 2023-2024 Suicide Prevention and Crisis Response Training Grant

- <u>SB18-272</u> and <u>HB21-1119</u> established a grant program for schools to support the implementation of comprehensive suicide prevention and crisis response efforts across Colorado. Enacting this legislation, the Office of Suicide Prevention releases an annual <u>application</u> for schools to request grants.
- Awarded funds may be used for staff training related to suicide prevention and crisis
- response.
- Grants may be awarded up to \$10,000.
- The application deadline is September 26, 2023.
- Training activities must be completed and funds must be spent by June 30, 2024.

# NEW Grants Awarded to the Help Expand the Number of School Psychologists and School Social Workers in Colorado

- <u>University of Colorado Denver</u>, <u>University of Northern Colorado</u>, <u>University of Denver</u> school psychology programs, and <u>Poudre School District</u>, in cooperation with Colorado State University's school social work program, were awarded <u>federal grants</u> to help address the nation's mental health crisis.
- <u>University of Colorado Denver's Project ASPIRE</u> will support diverse school psychology students to serve high-need schools using equity-focused mental health practices, emphasizing serving bilingual, early childhood, and low-income children populations in partnership with Denver Public Schools.

- <u>University of Denver's SPIRIT program</u> will recruit and train school psychologists in Colorado's rural communities.
- <u>University of Northern Colorado's program</u> will focus on training school psychology graduates working within rural districts or Spanish-speaking populations.
- <u>Poudre School District</u>, in cooperation with Colorado State University, will focus on supporting students with tuition support, paid internships, post-degree fellowship appointments, and clinical hours in PSD schools.

- In all other counties, the CDPHE delegates this authority to the local public health agency. Some counties inspect schools on a routine basis, while others respond to complaints only.

- HHS Awards \$31.5 Million in Behavioral Health Grants for Children, Youth, and Young Adults The U.S. Department of Health and Human Services (HHS), through the Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration, recently announced the award of \$31.5 million in behavioral health grants for children, youth, and young adults. Funds will help to address social, emotional, cognitive, physical, and behavioral aspects of youth development; interventions for youth and young adults at high risk of psychosis; and treatment, early intervention, and recovery support services for adolescents and young adults with substance use disorders.
- ED, HHS Take Additional Actions to Address Mental Health Needs of Students and Make Communities Safer The U.S. Department of Education (ED) and HHS sent a joint letter to governors highlighting resources to help states, communities, and schools support students' mental health and well-being, particularly students impacted by gun violence. The letter highlights ED's and HHS's investments and efforts to expand and improve school-based mental health services and supports, prepare and train school personnel and others to recognize the signs and symptoms of mental health impacts, and promote a safe and supportive school climate."
