Empowering Student Voices for Safe Schools!

NEW Applied Suicide Intervention Skills Training (ASIST)

• <u>Applied Suicide Intervention Skills Training (ASIST)</u> is a 2-day, two-trainer workshop designed by <u>LivingWorks</u> for members of all caregiving groups. Family, friends, and other

community members may be the first to talk with a person at risk of self-harm, but have little or no training. ASIST can also provide those in formal helping roles with professional development to ensure that they are prepared to provide suicide first aid help as part of the care they provide.

- What You Will Learn: Skills to provide a suicide first-aid intervention, work with someone to develop a personalized safety plan to keep safe-for-now, and connect with further help.
- Who: Open to professionals and the general public for participants aged 16 years and older.
- **Training format:** In-person skills-based workshop. Learn a 6-task suicide first-aid model through presentations, interactive discussion, and feature videos. Includes extensive opportunities for skills practice through trainer facilitated workgroups.
- Time commitment: 2 days (consecutive)
- **Cost: FREE** for the training, materials cost \$50 per person. Financial support opportunities may be available.

"Regarding the School Security Disbursement Grant 2024, Weld RE5J set out to improve district-wide interoperability. This grant allowed us to purchase radios and repeaters to enhance current coverage on school properties. In addition, it allowed us to reach multiple schools and the administration team at the administration building when emergencies arise. While a simple process, and relatively few hiccups along the way, the most difficult struggle was implementation and providing a policy standard practice on the operations and the context of the use of these radios.

Still an easy prospect, just needed to keep people on the point and direct them back if they strayed from the route established. Overall, this grant afforded the district a chance to have better communication when emergencies arise. We strive to push the bar for the safety and security of our schools and are proud we were able to use the Office of School Safety as a partner to achieve our highest priority goals for this grant."

NEW Colorado Department of Education Receives \$1.6 Million Annual Grant to Strengthen School-based Mental Health Services

- Colorado Commissioner of Education Susana Córdova announced the <u>Colorado Department</u> of <u>Education</u> will receive a \$1.6 million grant each year for five years from the U.S. Department of Education to enhance mental health services for students across the state.
- "The School-Based Mental Health Services Grant will support schools to hire more counselors and mental health professionals. It will provide funding to hire new workers, keep existing ones in their jobs and help some switch careers to work in schools. The grant includes funding for stipends, training for graduate-level school-based mental health supervisors, and developing pathways for clinic-based mental health professionals to transition to school-based roles."

REMINDER Naloxone (Narcan) Bulk Purchases

- Please remember that school districts are eligible for bulk purchases of Naloxone from the <u>Colorado Department of Public Health & Environment (CDPHE)</u>.
- This program allows eligible entities to purchase opiate antagonists, such as naloxone or Narcan, at low or no cost.
