

Applied Suicide Intervention Skills Training (ASIST) - Reach out to schedule

- Applied Suicide Intervention Skills Training (ASIST) is a 2-day, two-trainer workshop
 designed by LivingWorks for members of all caregiving groups. Family, friends, and other
 community members may be the first to talk with a person at risk of self-harm, but have
 little or no training. ASIST can also provide those in formal helping roles with professional
 development to ensure that they are prepared to provide suicide first aid help as part of
 the care they provide.
- What You Will Learn: Skills to provide a suicide first-aid intervention, work with someone to develop a personalized safety plan to keep safe-for-now, and connect with further help.
- Who: Open to professionals and the general public for participants aged 16 years and older.
- Training format: In-person skills-based workshop. Learn a 6-task suicide first-aid model through presentations, interactive discussion, and feature videos. Includes extensive opportunities for skills practice through trainer facilitated workgroups.
- Time commitment: 2 days (consecutive)
- Cost: FREE for the training, materials cost \$50 per person. Financial support opportunities may be available.

Through the School Safety Disbursement Grant, we were able to provide enhanced protective solutions for school windows. Keeping true to our all-hazards approach, this solution allowed our schools to be more energy efficient, reduce UV exposure, and protect the occupants in a variety of natural and human-caused events.

The School Safety Disbursement Grant provided us an opportunity to test these safety upgrades and evaluate their effectiveness prior to moving forward with a district-wide initiative to improve safety across all of our schools. Because St. Vrain was able to test the enhancements on a small scale at a few schools, the district was ready to scale the improvements district-wide in its November 2024 bond package, which passed overwhelmingly. As a result, the grant had a broad impact far beyond the schools it directly supported, enhancing school safety for every student in St. Vrain."

UPDATES FROM THE CRISIS RESPONSE UNIT

Welcome back everyone! Myself and the Crisis Response Unit hope you had a relaxing and refreshing holiday break. Our staff is gearing up to continue providing you all with crisis response training in the New Year. Remember that we now offer Crisis Response Skills for Varying Ages training. This training will help prepare your crisis responders to work with all students K-12. We had the pleasure of presenting this training to a large group of professionals in District 27.



Please remember we have a team of experienced school mental health professionals available to assist, for a limited time per incident, in the initial recovery period following a crisis incident when additional mental health resources are needed. Please reach out to Kati Garner at

Available Trainings From the Crisis Response Unit:

NEW Crisis Response Skills for Varying Ages

• This two hour training helps prepare crisis responders to work with all students K-12. Participants will learn crisis interventions and strategies for varied student age groups and have the opportunity to practice those strategies and skills.

PREPare Workshop Two, Mental Health Crisis Interventions. Responding to an Acute Traumatic Stressor in Schools

• This two-day workshop, designed primarily for mental health professionals, helps to develop the knowledge and skills required to provide immediate mental health crisis interventions to students, staff, and school community members who have been exposed to an acute traumatic stressor.

PREPaRE Workshop One, Comprehensive School Safety Planning Prevention Through Recovery

 This one-day workshop, designed primarily for administrators and safety team members, addresses critical components needed to develop, exercise and evaluate safety and crisis teams plans.

Crisis Response Plan Template

- Designed to provide K-12 school districts with essentials in writing crisis response plans, including sample policies, procedures, and crisis-related resources.
- Required 1 hour training on writing crisis response plans in order to access the template.

Psychological First Aid (PFA)

- An evidence-based approach to help students, staff, and community members in the immediate aftermath of a crisis.
- Options for PFA range from a brief two-hour training of the essentials of the model up to a full-day comprehensive training.

Calm-Engage-Distract

- Provides information on pediatric distress and developmentally appropriate strategies for responding to children in crisis.
- A brief training for educators on how to calm students after a critical incident.

Critical Incident Group Debriefing (CIGD) for staff

- Critical Incident Group Debriefing or CIGD, is a short-term group intervention process that focuses on an immediate event.
- CIGD is one of several methods that may be utilized to lessen the likelihood of people experiencing symptoms of trauma and stress after a critical incident.
- This group debriefing process provides a place for participants to talk and share experiences, and for the facilitator to teach and provide information about the impact of critical incidents.

NEW The US Department of Homeland Security's Invent2Prevent, Student-Led, Peer-Developed Initiative to Prevent Targeted School Violence

- Colorado high schools are once again invited to participate in a free school safety and prevention program sponsored by the <u>U.S. Department of Homeland Security (DHS)</u> starting January 2025 through May 2025.
- Invent2Prevent challenges high school students to create and implement peer-developed initiatives, products, and tools to prevent targeted violence and hate in ways "they believe" will be most effective in their schools and communities.
- The program is free of charge and for the last four years has been sponsored by the <u>DHS Center for Prevention Programs and Partnerships (CP3)</u>. Invent2Prevent is managed by EdVenture Partners who work with students throughout the entire project period in a guiding, mentoring, and coaching capacity.
- Each high school receives a \$1,000 budget to implement their Invent2Prevent project. Top teams present and participate in a national competition in DC in June, all expenses paid and compete for \$9,000 in cash awards. These experiential Invent2Prevent projects are developed by youth for youth and are extremely creative and effective.
- Thirty-five spots will be made available to high schools for the January through May 2025 academic period on a first come first served basis.

Colorado Department of Education Receives \$1.6 Million Annual Grant to Strengthen School-based Mental Health Services

- Colorado Commissioner of Education Susana Córdova announced the <u>Colorado Department</u>
 of <u>Education</u> will receive a \$1.6 million grant each year for five years from the U.S.
 Department of Education to enhance mental health services for students across the state.
- "The School-Based Mental Health Services Grant will support schools to hire more counselors and mental health professionals. It will provide funding to hire new workers, keep existing ones in their jobs and help some switch careers to work in schools. The grant includes funding for stipends, training for graduate-level school-based mental health supervisors, and developing pathways for clinic-based mental health professionals to transition to school-based roles."

- The focus of this program will include wildfire smoke preparedness planning, education, and training focused on healthy indoor air quality in community buildings and schools around Colorado, as well as how to establish community Cleaner Air Centers.
