Some important updates:

The Roadmaps for Action created from the work of the Educator Safety Task Force

were submitted to the Colorado legislature as required. Please find the link to all of the current information here including results of the survey completed by over 1,100 Colorado educators and an interview video by some of the task force members.

Trauma-Informed School Discipline

- This 1.5 hour training will equip administrators and other disciplinary staff with the
 knowledge, skills, and strategies to approach discipline with a trauma-informed lens.
 Through a blend of foundational pre-teaching and an interactive case study, participants
 will explore the impact of trauma, proactive approaches that create positive school
 environments, practical techniques for de-escalation, discipline, and relationship-building.

Applied Suicide Intervention Skills Training (ASIST) - Reach out to schedule

• Applied Suicide Intervention Skills Training (ASIST) is a 2-day, two-trainer workshop designed



by <u>LivingWorks</u> for members of all caregiving groups. Family, friends, and other community members may be the first to talk with a person at risk of self-harm, but have little or no training. ASIST can also provide those in formal helping roles with professional development to ensure that they are prepared to provide suicide first aid help as part of the care they provide.

- What You Will Learn: Skills to provide a suicide first-aid intervention, work with someone to develop a personalized safety plan to keep safe-for-now, and connect with further help.
- Who: Open to professionals and the general public for participants aged 16 years and older.
- Training format: In-person skills-based workshop. Learn a 6-task suicide first-aid model through presentations, interactive discussion, and feature videos. Includes extensive opportunities for skills practice through trainer facilitated workgroups.
- Time commitment: 2 days (consecutive)
- Cost: FREE for the training, materials cost \$50 per person. Financial support opportunities may be available.

SAFER Grant-Congratulations are in Order!

The State of Colorado's legislature allocated \$4,850,000 for the Fiscal Year 2026 School Access for Emergency Response Grant Program. The Colorado Office of School Safety received 39 grant applications for a total requested amount of \$14,676,039.71. For this round of the School Access for Emergency Response grant 14 applicants were selected to receive funding as directed by SB23-241. Thank you to all of those who applied for the FY2026 SAFER.


