THE DIRECTOR'S CORNER

Dear Colleagues:

We know the last few weeks have been frustrating with hoax threats. These are happening all over the country. Unfortunately, each threat must be addressed with your law

enforcement partners. However, if you can encourage students, staff, and parents not to share unconfirmed threats on social media, that should help. Instead, suggest they report rumors that they hear to either your district's safety and security office or Safe2Tell. The Cybersecurity & Infrastructure Agency (CISA) came out with new resources to assist with these threats. The Anonymized Threat Response Guidance contains both a Toolkit and Reference Guide. We also want to remind you that there are suggestions about lockdown drills when a fire drill is also



necessary in this white paper from the Division of Fire Prevention and Control and the Office of School Safety.

- Please note: <u>Campus Safety Magazine reports that over 700 students have been arrested for false threats since the shooting at Apalachee High School in Georgia.</u>
- ❖ The first working meeting of the Educator Safety Task Force under HB24-1320 occurred on September 12th. The Office of School Safety has a webpage to keep everyone updated on the task force's work. Minutes from the first meeting can be viewed there. Also, as we begin to form working committees, we welcome anyone who would like to assist. Simply reach out to me and we will be happy to have you join a committee. Thank you!
- ❖ The work of the Interagency School Safety Working Group (SSWG), that originally took place in 2023, is continuing. Co-chaired by the OSS and CDE, the Steering Committee met on September 24th. The first task of this group will be to update school safety resources provided by all state agencies and then to gather them into a new website that will be ready by January. If you didn't get a chance to read the original report submitted to the Colorado Legislature in January of 2024, this link will take you to that report.
- The Office of School Safety welcomed Jonathan Hernandez-Cooper, our new Data

- Analyst, in September. Jonathan came to the OSS from Denver Public Schools and has already been upgrading our data collection systems. We are so happy to have him on board!

UPDATES FROM THE CRISIS RESPONSE UNIT

September has been a busy month for the Crisis Response Unit. Our staff has been training schools across the state in PREPaRE and reaching out to connect with all of you to learn about your needs and how we can support! We would like to remind you that the Crisis Response Unit is here to assist in overall crisis management, from preparing and preventing incidents to responding to and helping with a school's post crisis needs. We are excited to have a team of experienced school mental health professionals available to assist, for a limited time per incident, in the initial recovery period following a crisis incident when additional mental health resources are needed. Available Trainings From the Crisis Response Unit:

PREPaRE Workshop Two, Mental Health Crisis Interventions. Responding to an Acute Traumatic Stressor in Schools

• This two-day workshop, designed primarily for mental health professionals, helps to develop the knowledge and skills required to provide immediate mental health crisis interventions to students, staff, and school community members who have been exposed to an acute traumatic stressor.

Crisis Response Plan Template

- Designed to provide K-12 school districts with essentials in writing crisis response plans, including sample policies, procedures, and crisis-related resources.
- Required 1 hour training on writing crisis response plans in order to access the template.

Psychological First Aid (PFA)

- An evidence-based approach to help students, staff, and community members in the immediate aftermath of a crisis.
- Options for PFA range from a brief two-hour training of the essentials of the model up to a full-day comprehensive training.

Calm-Engage-Distract

- Provides information on pediatric distress and developmentally appropriate strategies for responding to children in crisis.
- A brief training for educators on how to calm students after a critical incident.

Critical Incident Group Debriefing (CIGD) for staff

- Critical Incident Group Debriefing or CIGD, is a short-term group intervention process that focuses on an immediate event.
- CIGD is one of several methods that may be utilized to lessen the likelihood of people experiencing symptoms of trauma and stress after a critical incident.
- This group debriefing process provides a place for participants to talk and share experiences, and for the facilitator to teach and provide information about the impact of critical incidents.

PREPaRE Workshop One, Comprehensive School Safety Planning Prevention Through Recovery

• This one-day workshop, designed primarily for administrators and safety team members, addresses critical components needed to develop, exercise and evaluate safety and crisis teams plans.
