





MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING

The Colorado Threat Assessment and Management Protocol: A Model for Training and Implementation

Project Description: Over the last ten years, the Colorado School Safety Resource Center (CSSRC) has partnered with local stakeholders and national experts to develop the Colorado Threat Assessment and Management Protocol (CTAMP) instrument and training program. The program helps multidisciplinary intervention teams identify, evaluate, and manage students posing a security risk or safety threat. While based on federal recommendations and best practices, the CTAMP has not yet been formally evaluated.

The proposed project seeks to pilot and evaluate the training program for the Colorado Threat Assessment and Management Protocol (CTAMP) with 35 multidisciplinary teams in middle and high schools in Colorado. The proposed process evaluation will examine: (1) the extent to which the CTAMP training program increases participants' threat assessment knowledge, skills, and capacity and (2) the extent to which the CTAMP training is implemented in schools as intended.

Project Goals:

- Update and refine the Colorado Threat Assessment and Management Protocol.
- Evaluate and monitor the implementation of the CTAMP Training Program

Data Collection: The evaluation of the CTAMP Training Program is being conducted by researchers at the Center for the Study and Prevention of Violence. If your school agrees to participate, you will be asked to take part in all evaluation activities described in the project overview.


Privacy and Confidentiality¹: In order to ensure privacy and uphold confidentiality, data collected as part of this project will be kept confidential and will not identify the participating district, school, student, or educator. Threat Assessment Training Surveys will be completed anonymously. Threat Assessment case reviews will be kept confidential and will only capture de-identified case information to help improve the CTAMP Training Program. All data will be securely stored to prevent unauthorized access, disclosure, or loss of information.

Create or strengthen their Multidisciplinary Threat Assessment team, if needed	If a school does not already have a multidisciplinary threat assessment team, the participating schools team will be asked to create a multidisciplinary threat assessment team of 3-5 people from different backgrounds such as an administrator, school mental health professional, resource officer, law enforcement officer, teacher. The team will be asked to participate in the CTAMP training. If a school has an existing multidisciplinary team but does not include 3-5 people from different backgrounds, then the school will be asked to add members to their team. Submit performance measures required for the semi-annual report	One member of the multidisciplinary team will be asked to answer a series of questions about their multidisciplinary team, the number of threat assessments, type of threat assessments during each reporting period.
