Key Themes & Takeaways	<ul> <li>Alternative Placement Models</li> <li>Members Discussed: <ul> <li>Center-based programs within schools for specific needs</li> <li>Flexible student-to-staff ratios</li> <li>Fluid movement between specialized centers and general education classrooms</li> </ul> </li> <li>Creating Supportive Environments Members Discussed: <ul> <li>"Zen dens" or drop-in centers for student self-regulation</li> <li>Comfortable, non-traditional seating (e.g., bean bags, yoga balls, standing desks)</li> <li>Low lighting and cozy atmospheres to promote calm</li> <li>Emphasis on creating a culture of acceptance and understanding</li> </ul> </li> <li>Staffing and Professional Development Members Discussed: <ul> <li>Importance of staff with specialized training (e.g., BCBAs, RBTs, and ABAs)</li> <li>Potential for Medicaid billing to offset costs of specialized staff</li> <li>Need for ongoing training and collaboration among all school staff</li> </ul> </li> </ul>
