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Welcome & Introductions	Confluence PSG President, Berrick Abramson and the Director of the Office of School Safety, Chris Harms gave welcoming remarks.

	 Prior to and at time of incident (of aggressive student behavior) Following an incident
Key Themes & Takeaways	 Key Takeaways De-escalation training emerged as a top priority for all staff, along with understanding behavior as communication Post-incident support critical, including immediate trauma response for staff and structured debriefing/planning New/inexperienced staff often underprepared; need upfront communication about potential incidents and ongoing skill-building
	Pre-Incident Training & Support Needs

Members Discussed

- De-escalation techniques (verbal and non-verbal) critical for all staff
- Understanding of behavior as communication, trauma impacts on brain
- Special education processes, common disabilities, legal implications
- School-specific protocols, crisis team access, chain of command
- Relationship-building skills to prevent escalation
- Realistic expectations/preparation for potential incidents
- Ongoing skill-building opportunities

At Time of Incident Response

Members Discussed

- Clear protocols on who to contact, backup plans
- De-escalation strategies (e.g., reducing verbal input)
- Understanding of allowable physical interventions
- Awareness of student-specific behavior plans
- Ability to quickly assess safety needs (self, student, others)

Post-Incident Support

Members Discussed:

- Immediate trauma response for staff (e.g., 20-minute break)
- Structured debriefing to analyze incident (what worked/didn't)
- Future planning to prevent recurrence
- Documentation guidance (what/how to record)
- Support for classroom reintegration (both student and peers)
- Parent/family communication protocols
- Ongoing skill-building based on incident learnings
