• Severe shortage of facility schools and alternative
<ul> <li>Educator Perspectives &amp; Supports</li> <li>Mixed views on more training - seen as valuable but concerns about time/capacity</li> <li>Need supports beyond just training (e.g. smaller class sizes, more staff)</li> <li>Desire for clear protocols/flowcharts on how to respond to incidents</li> </ul>
<ul> <li>School Culture, Climate &amp; Community Relations • Importance of measuring school climate/culture and setting goals</li> <li>Need to engage families/community more often and early on</li> <li>Challenge is making culture/climate efforts part of "how we do business" vs. just an add-on</li> </ul>
<ul> <li>challenges; recommendations should address both short and long-term needs</li> <li>Members Discussed:</li> <li>Incident Response Models</li> <li>Co-responder model seen as high priority, but needs clarity on roles/implementation</li> <li>Desire for handbook/guidebook consolidating best practices for incident response</li> <li>Need for protocols to better support teachers/students after incidents (e.g. debrief, regulation time)</li> <li>Training on de-escalation and situational awareness are important but concern remains about where to find time</li> </ul>
existing workloads and limited time/resources • School culture/climate is critical but challenging to mandate; may need to focus on measurement and goal-setting • Alternative placements and facility schools are in high demand but limited supply; need creative solutions in meantime • Funding and staffing shortages underlie many

	<ul> <li>placement options</li> <li>Need creative solutions like district-run programs while building more capacity</li> <li>Staffing these programs is a major challenge due to pay and safety concerns</li> </ul>
