Key Themes & Takeaways	 Key Takeaways Survey of educators revealed alarmingly high rates of physical injuries and lack of support/reporting Task force is developing multi-pronged recommendations for school, district and state-level actions Careful consideration needed on how to frame and communicate findings to various stakeholder groups Focus on actionable, differentiated recommendations tailored to different school/district contexts
	Topics Discussed
	Educator Safety Survey Results
	 Over 1,100 respondents including general education teachers, administrators, special education teachers, paraprofessionals 74.5% experienced or witnessed student attempt to injure an adult; 50.1% personally injured by student Majority felt unsupported after incidents and hesitant to report due to fear of retaliation Lack of consistent reporting processes and follow-up support emerged as key issues Results far exceed previously known incident rates, indicating significant underreporting
	 District-Level Ideas for Recommendations Improved communication systems (radios, walkie-talkies, phones) in all classrooms Increased mental health professionals to meet national recommended ratios Provide paid time off for staff to recover from incidents Create regional support systems for mental health professionals Explore Medicaid funding to support co-responder models

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	State Agency Ideas for Recommendations
	 Office of School Safety & Colorado Department of Education: Expand regional training consultants, develop de-escalation training, create micro-learning modules, enhance implementation guidance on safety policies. Behavioral Health Administration: Train school-based mental health supports (funding concerns noted) More supports and cross-collaborations for smaller/rural districts
	 Educator and Administrator Preparation Programs Ideas for Recommendations Enhance training on classroom management, de-escalation, and trauma-informed practices Integrate more hands-on experience with diverse student populations Strengthen preparation of school leaders to foster positive school cultures
