Board Member Roles and Responsibilities

*SOMB Enabling Statute:*

*The general assembly finds that, to protect the public and to work toward the elimination of sexual offenses, it is necessary to comprehensively evaluate, identify, treat, manage, and monitor adult sex offenders who are subject to the supervision of the criminal justice system and juveniles who have committed sexual offenses who are subject to the supervision of the juvenile justice system. Therefore, the general assembly declares that it is necessary to create a program that establishes evidence-based standards for the evaluation, identification, treatment, management, and monitoring of adult sex offenders and juveniles who have committed sexual offenses at each stage of the criminal or juvenile justice system to prevent offenders from reoffending and enhance the protection of victims and potential victims. The general assembly does not intend to imply that all offenders can or will positively respond to treatment.*

Board Member Roles and Responsibilities include:

- Assisting the Sex Offender Management Board and Staff in completing its legislative mandates as outlined in C.R.S. 16-11.7-101-109;
- Attending 12 Board meetings per year, the 3<sup>rd</sup> Friday of each month from 9am until 4pm;
- Participating on at least one committee of the Board generally meeting one time per month;
- Appropriately representing the profession for which you have been appointed;
- Appointments are for four-year terms.

## Sex Offender Management Board Board Nomination Process

The Colorado Sex Offender Management Board, within the Division of Criminal Justice at the Department of Public Safety has outlined the following process for appointing members to the Board pursuant to C.R.S. 16-11.7-103.

The Board and Staff to the Board have created a Nomination Work Group that will oversee the nomination process as positions become vacant.

- As openings occur the SOMB will discuss the specific opening and outline current needs of the Board. Board members having a specific interest in a particular opening may sit on the Nomination Work Group for that appointment process. The Board may also recommend an expert in the field, not on the Board, to sit on the Nomination Work Group for a particular opening;
- The Nomination Work Group will distribute nomination packets to SOMB members, as well as agencies and individuals related to the specific opening;
- The Nomination Work Group, through the SOMB staff, will receive completed nomination packets for review;
- Based on needs outlined by the SOMB, the Nomination Work Group may interview a select number of nominees. Following the interview process, the Nomination Work Group will select up to three individuals to forward to the DCJ Director. The Work Group will order those selected by preference for appointment to the Board;
- The Director of the Division of Criminal Justice, following a review of the nominees, will forward their recommendation to the Executive Director of the Department of Public Safety for final appointment.
