Carl Blake updated the Sex Offender Management Board (SOMB) on the Application Review Committee’s (ARC’s) progress on a variance in place for Chelsea Beck.

Chris Lobanov-Rostovsky reminded the SOMB about a survey to be completed in preparation for the Moving Forward Day on November 20 at Cheyenne Mountain Resort. More information to come via email.

Raechel Alderete updated the SOMB on the Introduction to Adult and Juvenile Standards trainings that are now full. She noted that the Standards booster training will be held in November.

Cathy Rodriguez announced that the Department of Regulatory Agencies (DORA) Mental Health Boards have 5 vacancies and to contact her if interested.

Ingrid Barrier offered to the SOMB the opportunity to review the appeal hearing process. The SOMB expressed interest in such a discussion.

**Adult Standards Guiding Principles (Decision Item) – Adult Standards Revisions Committee**

Jeff Geist noted that process for this agenda item is to have motion on each Guiding Principle to accept the changes and then a discussion can follow and changes made if needed. Jeff also mentioned that he and Chris Lobanov-Rostovsky went through the Committee’s deliberations to see where there were close votes and alternative language, which has been provided to the SOMB.

Judge Kopcow chaired this portion of the meeting.

Carl Blake indicated that he doubts that alternative language under the Guiding Principle #1 is necessary because it sounds like a preamble to all of the guiding principles and not just a description for this one.

John Odenheimer suggested 2 edits in the paragraph: saying "offender" rather than client/sexual offender.

Allison Boyd mentioned that the Committee was trying to keep the Guiding Principles concise and that the Committee felt as though many made a strong statement on their own.

Jessica Meza asked how to proceed to ask for the alternative language to be a preamble.

Chris Lobanov-Rostovsky answered that procedurally, the SOMB needs to vote on the motion on the table which is to accept Guiding Principle 1 as a stand-alone and then follow up with a motion to change the alternative language into a preamble.

Laurie Kepros mentioned to the SOMB that she submitted a different alternate language to the SOMB. Laurie also noted that the SOMB decided to use words such as client, sexual offender, and others, strictly based on context.

Tom Leversee noted that the Guiding Principles are what SOMB aspires to and these are foundational principles to which the SOMB strives.

Allison Boyd suggested a slight change to Guiding Principle #2 and passed along a handout on the proposed verbiage. The biggest difference is whether to include or exclude "can" in the phrasing and she added an additional sentence.

Laurie Kepros mentioned that the SOMB should consider not just victims but also communities and families who are impacted by sex offenses. She also mentioned that it makes sense to consider "some" in the language.

Missy Gursky announced that the big challenge for the Committee was including "can" and what was under the guiding principle.

Allison Boyd explained that this new statement is supported by literature and research.

Judge Marcelo Kopcow noted that a good compromise should be for the statement to say "can lead" to common and serious consequences.
