

## Resources for Victim Representation

1. Therapist who is working with the victim on the case
  2. Victim representative with the offense specific treatment agency
  3. Victim Witness Assistance Unit staff person at the District Attorney's Office assigned to the case
  4. Victim Advocate with a local agency, such as a non profit sexual assault crisis center
  5. Victim therapist who is willing to provide a general victims' perspective though s/he is not working with the specific victim on the case
  6. Caseworker with the Department of Human Services (DHS) assigned to the case/victim
  7. Guardian Ad Litem (GAL) for the victim
  8. Court Appointed Special Advocate (CASA) worker assigned to case
  9. Friend or family member of the victim whom the CST/MDT deems is suitable and appropriate to provide victim representation to the team
  10. Division of Youth Corrections Victim Representative
  11. Victim Assistance Coordinator at the Department of Corrections
  12. Victim Liaison in the Sex Offender Treatment and Management Program (SOTMP) at the Department of Corrections
