ESSENTIAL FUNCTIONS:

- Provide Sex Offender Management Board (SOMB) approved treatment services within the residential setting.
- Provides individual, family and group therapy as indicated by program/school needs.
- Develops and oversees the completion of treatment on an individual, family and group basis. Services include: clinical assessment, service planning, individual, group, family and milieu therapies, counseling, case management, record keeping and service coordination with a multi-disciplinary team.
- Develops expertise in differential assessment, treatment readiness and change model, and motivational interviewing.
- Documents and assesses the effectiveness of specific interventions toward meeting the objectives and goals of the treatment plan.
- Documents all therapy and contacts with clients and other service providers.
- Maintains clients' clinical files in a timely and orderly fashion.
- Provides crisis intervention as needed. Ensures documentation is completed.
- Transports clients for therapeutic services when needed.
- Prepares monthly progress notes, staffing reports, plans and discharge summaries.
- Provides clinical supervision to staff and interns.
- Provides oversight of skill groups.
- Ensures the safety, health and welfare of staff and students at all times.
- Provides encouragement, guidance and resources to staff and students when needed.
- Models and ensures all program norms are upheld without compromise.
- Acts as a positive role model and mentor for both staff and students.
- Treats others with respect, confronts negative behavior and supports confrontations.
- Completes required reports and documentation in a timely manner, provides management with required reports and advises of any problematic situations.

QUALIFICATIONS:

- SOMB Approved Juvenile Treatment Provider.
- Master's Degree and licensure in the field of mental health as a Licensed Clinical Social Worker (LCSW), Licensed Social Worker (LSW), Licensed Professional Counselor (LPC), or Licensed Professional Counselor Candidate (LPCC) with the Colorado Department of Regulatory Agencies (DORA).
- Obtain the appropriate number of CEUs each year to maintain licensure
- One year of prior experience working in a residential/school setting with at-risk students, their families and the Juvenile Justice System preferred.
